Headteacher's Message

Welcome Back!

On behalf of all the staff at Ralph Butterfield Primary School, I would like to wish everyone a happy New Year; I do hope that 2023 brings all of our families many joyful times and some wonderful opportunities.

One opportunity that you may be interested in, is becoming a parent governor. A parent governor is a volunteer, usually a parent/carer of a child currently attending the school, who has the enthusiasm to contribute towards the effective governance and overall success of the school. Parent governors are appointed through an election process; I will be sending parents/carers all of the information needed for this by the end of next week. Do please look out for this and consider joining our dedicated board of governors. It is a great way to get to know more about the school and have a further positive impact on school life.

Our governing board is also seeking to appoint a co-opted governor. A co-opted governor is an individual from the community who can work with the governing board to appropriately support and challenge the school. This person would not be a parent/carer of a child at our school. Our governing board would be very grateful if you could please have a think about anyone you know e.g. socially or through work, who may be interested. Please ask them to contact school and we can arrange for them to have a no obligation, informal chat with our chair of governors to find out more about the role. Thank you.

A further opportunity we have available is for a midday supervisor. This is a brilliant role to have at Ralph Butterfield Primary School - one where such a positive difference can be made through interactions with the children and ensuring they have a safe and enjoyable lunch time. We are also fortunate to have a really enthusiastic and caring team of MSAs who would be welcoming and supportive of their new team member. We can be really flexible with days if someone is interested but cannot to commit to every day. Please do mention this role to anyone who may be interested and further details can be obtained from the school office. If you wanted just to find out more about the job, we could arrange an informal chat with our senior midday supervisor.

Our Attendance and Absence Policy was updated in December and can be viewed on our website or by clicking <u>here</u>.

Please remember that all 'Leave of absence' requests require the completion of the 'Application for pupil leave of absence from school' form. These also need completing for medical and dental appointments known about in advance; please do show evidence of appointments where you have it. Please be aware that there is no entitlement to additional holidays outside of normal school holiday times. The policy does make clear what is and isn't eligible for consideration in relation to pupil leave of absence requests. As a school, we are always available to talk through any concerns that you may have; please don't hesitate to contact myself via the school if you have any questions or concerns.



As we start the new term and following the update to our School Uniform Policy, (<u>click here to view in full</u>), please read the following reminders regarding the styling of hair and the wearing of jewellery. Thank you for supporting us with this from home.

- For safety reasons, long hair must be tied back at all times during PE lessons.
- We allow pupils to style their hair in a way which is appropriate for school.
- Watches should not be smart watches and not linked to mobile phones.
- Rings, necklaces, bracelets and earrings are a hazard in school:
 - Jewellery may be worn if required for medical reasons, e.g. a medical bracelet. In these circumstances parents/carers must apply in writing to the Headteacher.
 - The wearing of earrings is discouraged in school. If parents opt for their child to wear earrings, they
 must be small plain gold/silver studs only; hoops and large or dangly earrings are not permitted. Only
 one pair of small studs is allowed to be worn in school.
 - If a child has had their ears pierced and they are still within the 6 weeks healing period where they cannot take them out, they will need to be taped up for PE before school until the 6-week period is over. This is on the understanding that parents take responsibility for sending their child with earrings in, should their child have an injury as a result of having earrings in.

School Dinners

Thank you to those parents/carers who regularly book their child(ren)'s meals via ParentPay. We are, unfortunately, still needing to book meals for upwards of 40 children each day, which takes valuable time and impacts upon other essential office tasks. Dinners can be booked on ParentPay up to a term in advance, with children then making their meal choice during morning registration. Can we please request that all dinners are booked, by 9am, on the day which they are required? It is also very useful for parents/carers to have discussed the meal options with their child(ren) before they arrive at school. Thank you for your support with this.

School dinners for Key Stage 2 children (Years 3-6) are charged at £2.40 per day, unless a child is eligible for Free School Meals; all meals need to be paid for upon booking via ParentPay. Thank you. Should a meal be booked manually via the school office, the charge will then appear within your child's ParentPay account; payments should please be made to ensure that no ParentPay account has a balance below £0. If meals are booked, on ParentPay, by parents/carers this also helps to ensure that no debt balances occur. Thank you.
