Acting Headteacher's Message

Over the last few weeks, I have been very fortunate to have had the opportunity to show visitors around our amazing school. We feel very proud when welcoming visitors, who have heard positive things about our school, who would like to come and see for themselves. Over the weeks we were visited by Martin Kelly (Director of Children and Education), Councillor Bob Webb (Executive Member for Children, Young People and Education) and headteachers from other maintained schools in York. Our visitors toured the school, talked to pupils and staff, and we were able to share the comprehensive SEND provision that we offer. It is always a joy taking visitors around our school and the children are incredibly impressive when answering questions. When children were asked about what they enjoy, it was very clear that different subjects are inspiring different children; this is why we are so passionate about retaining our broad and ambitious curriculum.

<u> Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)</u>

This week, the children have been enjoying finalising their roles in our nativity 'I-Spy Christmas'. Thank you for your help in providing costumes and sending them in to school. Bringing together the acting, character lines and songs has brought the nativity to life and we are very much looking forward to sharing it with you next week.



In **phonics** this week, the children have applied their knowledge of the phonemes learnt so far this year, to continue to practise sounding out and blending words to both read and spell them. They have also continued to practise reading words which add 's', for example, cups – sings – tins.

On Monday, some exciting visitors appeared in Reception. The Christmas tricky word elves have arrived! The children were introduced to the tricky word elf challenge. Each day, the children will be looking out for the Christmas elves and reading their tricky words. We will keep you updated!





In **maths** this week, we have learnt different ways of making 5. The children decorate Christmas trees with five baubles, for example, 3 red and 2 blue. Then they recorded their additions in a number sentence.



Key Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2)

Every week is a busy week in school but the run-up to Christmas in Key Stage 1 is even busier than usual! This week, we took to the stage and put all of our songs, dances, lines, actions and even costumes together in an intensive week of rehearsing for our nativity production. It was wonderful to see the whole show come together so well; the children worked so hard




concentrating on the actions so that they knew when to come on the stage and deliver their parts. We would like to say a great big thank you for all your support with getting costumes and helping the children to learn their lines. We can't wait to show you the finished result!

Of course, the nativity isn't the only thing that has happened this week. In English, we have written our own versions of the story "Emma Jane's Aeroplane", using the book as a model and changing it with our own ideas. In our versions, Emma Jane was flying her aeroplane around



York, making animal friends and taking them on adventures. From a cat who wanted an ice cream at Creepy Crawlies to a duck that wanted to swim in Wigginton duck pond, our stories were full of imagination and exciting language. We worked really hard over several days on the stories and the results were amazing! Well done for writing such entertaining stories, everyone.

On Thursday, Hannah from Phunky Foods came into school to teach Class 3 and 4 all about healthy eating. After her whole-school assembly, in which she showed us what it meant to eat a balanced diet, she came into class and gave us a practical cooking lesson in which we made a fruit crunch. We learned how to safely cut fruit with a knife using the 'tunnel' and 'claw' grip techniques. We also learned about food hygiene and why it is so important. But best of all, we were able to make a healthy snack and then eat it afterwards!

Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3 & 4)



It was lovely to begin our week by welcoming so many of our parents and carers into school for the Lower Junior 'Stone Age Open Classroom event'. The children thoroughly enjoyed showcasing some of their fantastic art and design technology work; we know that all the children were really proud of their efforts. It wasn't only the children's

work that caught our eye - some of the adult's cave drawings on Monday were very impressive too! Thank you to all of you who were able to join us and we really hope you enjoyed it!





In computing this week, the children began their 'Simulations' unit. They learnt that computer simulations can represent real or imaginary situations. They considered when a simulation might be used instead of a real life situation. For example, a pilot's cockpit simulation is beneficial as it would be too dangerous to learn how to fly a plane without the

prior practise. Next, as a class, we thought carefully about the advantages and disadvantages of using simulations instead of the real thing. In the next lesson, the children will explore a given simulation and evaluate its usefulness when compared to a real life situation.

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Upper Key Stage 2 (Years 5 & 6)



In our study of Christianity, we have been learning about how Christians follow the teachings of Jesus. One such person we focused upon was Mother Teresa. We learnt about the key historical events in her life, the work that she undertook and the impact of this work on the world. We discussed how her actions reflected her Christian faith and how she followed Jesus'

teachings.

As part of our science lessons this week, we have been learning about the phases of the moon. We learnt that the moon rotates whilst it orbits the Earth so that the same side is always facing towards us. The children were especially excited to talk about how the moon was formed.





In English this week, during our narrative work, we have started to look at the impact of incorporating dialogue within our writing whilst also building suspense and tension to engage the reader. The story we are basing our writing on is 'The Controller'; this follows the story of a young boy who has to help his mother escape from a computer game. We have also looked at developing cohesion throughout our work in order for our stories to flow and the events to link together.

Big Soft Ginger Cookies (source: www.tasteofhome.com)

Ingredients

- 3/4 cup (170g) butter, softened
- 1 cup (200g) granulated sugar, plus additional for rolling
- 1 large egg, room temperature
- 1/4 cup (**80g**) molasses
- 2-1/4 cups (281g) all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons ground ginger
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 3/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
 1/4 teaspoon salt



Directions

- Preheat the oven to 180°.
- > In a large bowl, cream butter and 1 cup sugar until light and fluffy, 5-7 minutes. Beat in egg and molasses.
- > Combine the flour, ginger, baking soda, cinnamon, cloves and salt; gradually add to the creamed mixture and mix well.
- > Roll into 1-1/2-in. balls, then roll in additional sugar. Place 2 in. apart on ungreased baking sheets.
- > Bake at 180° until puffy and lightly browned, 10-12 minutes.
- > Remove to wire racks to cool.
