

Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)



A huge welcome back to our wonderful Reception children! We have loved hearing about the children's busy half term breaks. They have returned filled with enthusiasm and wonder for another exciting topic: 'Let's celebrate'. This half term, we will be learning about lots of different festivals and celebrations including the children's own birthday celebrations.

In phonics, we have been so pleased with how the children have retained the phonemes learnt so far! We have learnt three new diagraphs this week: ff, II, ss and the phoneme j. Children have also resumed their reading practice sessions and are enjoying discussing the stories within our wordless and worded books.



In maths, we have focussed on 1 more and 1 less. This has included playing bus journeys with passengers getting on and off the bus and taking 1 less away in songs like 5 Currant Buns and 5 Little Men in a Flying Saucer.

On Monday, the children learnt about celebrating Diwali (following recent celebrations around the world). They enjoyed learning the story of Rama and Sita, finding out how Hindus and Sikhs celebrate this special celebration and made diva lamps.





On Tuesday, the children practised their writing skills to add describing words to their marble rolled firework scenes. It is amazing to see the segmenting being used to spell and write words like pop, whizz (wizz) and bang.

P.E lessons have changed days this term. Both Class 1 and Class 2 met Mr Stephenson from Total Sports on Friday. They began to develop multi-skills in their lesson this week and had lots of fun.

Thank you for sharing entries of your half-term activities on Tapestry. It has been lovely for the children to share these with us.



Key Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2)

On Monday, we had an exciting afternoon to launch our new topic, all about relationships. We were thinking about how we can show respect to other people by being mindful of their personal



space, or 'bubble' and staying out of it when not invited in. We did a lovely piece of artwork by making a self portrait and drawing this imaginary bubble around it. We then used paint, mixed with washing up liquid, and straws to blow bubbles and make a colourful patterned background. We also designed our own towns as a way of thinking about the roles and responsibilities that people have in our community. We cut out and stuck

down road sections to make a layout and then carefully planned which buildings to add and where to put them to make sure our communities had everything that they needed.

Tuesday was a very special day. It was Bonfire Night! We thought about our experiences of watching fireworks and how we could describe how our senses are impacted. We produced some

fantastic artwork by cutting toilet rolls into strips and spreading them outwards. This created a stamp which we then dipped in coloured paint and printed onto black card to create wonderful firework effects. We were so inspired by this that we were able to come up with a huge variety of descriptive language for the sights, sounds and sensations of Bonfire Night. We then used this descriptive language to write fabulous descriptive poems and acrostics.









We have had a very creative week indeed and in art we had an opportunity to practise sketching techniques. We developed our observation skills to look carefully at an object and sketch it. We planned our work, drawing marks to plan its size on the page and then carefully copied the

shapes and lines that we saw. We then used different grades of pencil to shade the dark areas to create shadows. We were all very impressed with the care that everyone took when drawing.

What a fantastic first week back it has been, Key Stage 1!

Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3 & 4)

Year 3 and 4 have had a brilliant start to the second half of the autumn term.

This week, the children have considered what the meaning of this half term's big question, 'Why can't I?' means. This question is linked to the Fundamental British Value 'Rule of Law'. As part of their learning, the children were asked about what rules they have at home and in school. After discussing the rules that they follow, the children identified that as a society we all have rules to abide by as the law. We all agreed that even though there are some rules that we don't like or would like to



change, that they are needed to ensure the safety and equal treatment of everyone. The children then identified what the consequences of breaking the law would be compared to breaking a rule.



Our Design Technology project this half term is linked to our overarching topic from Flint to Iron (Stone Age to Iron Age), focusing on materials and construction. The children were very excited to find out that they would be making their very own round house. To begin with, the children were reminded about what houses were like during prehistoric times once people had begun to settle in one place and then they designed their own round house. The children thought very carefully about how the

houses should look and the materials they could use so their house would be a true representation of the time period. Afterwards, the children planned and drew the sequence of actions to produce their house. The plans for the houses are looking fantastic, we can't wait to construct them over the next few weeks.

In computing this week, the children started to learn how to use Logo. Logo is a text-based coding programme used to control an on-screen arrow (turtle) to create mathematical patterns. During their first lesson, the children learnt how to understand and use the language of Logo, for example FD is forward and BK is backwards. They then looked at a set of instructions and predicted what shape it would create. When the children had made their prediction, they had a go at inputting the instructions to see what shape it actually made. Their predictions weren't far off.





This half term, our PE lessons will consists of a mixture of in and outdoor lessons (REAL Gym, REAL PE and the Ultimate Warrior virtual competition). Therefore, please can you ensure that you child/ren has their indoor (including plimsoles) and outdoor PE kits in school.

Our PE days are - Class 6 - Monday and Tuesday / Class 7 - Monday and Tuesday / Class 8 - Monday and Wednesday

Upper Key Stage 2 (Years 5 & 6)



In our reading lessons this week, we have focused on non-fiction texts. We read a selection of short, non-chronological reports and then answered a series of questions about them; this included a focus on retrieval type questions and questions that required us to consider the meaning of the vocabulary. By varying the types of texts that we are reading, we can broaden our understanding of different genres.

This week, as part of our work on Black History Month, we created profiles about the remarkable Frederick Douglass. As we delved into his life, we learned about his incredible journey from slavery to becoming a powerful advocate for freedom and equality. We engaged in research, discussing Douglass's writings and speeches. Our enthusiasm and creativity shone through as we presented our profiles, showcasing not only Douglass's achievements but also the importance of standing up for justice.






This week in computing, we created games on Purple Mash. Using the interactive program 2DIY, we learned the basics of game mechanics. The excitement was palpable as we brainstormed ideas, designed characters and planned engaging settings. We learnt how to upload images and use the drawing tools to create the walls, floor, and roof of our simulated environment before we created a sprite to explore our digital worlds. Once

completed we evaluated one another's work and provided constructive feedback.
