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
# After School Cookery Club

# Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)

We are really pleased with how all of the children in Reception are settling into their new school and classes. It has been a pleasure to be greeted by warm smiles each morning, and the children are enjoying exploring all of the Reception areas. Thank you for your support in helping your children to enter school confidently each day.





This week, we began our phonics journey and started learning the letter sounds (phonemes) for s, a, t and p. You can view the pronunciations they will have learnt for each of these letters by using this link <a href="https://youtu.be/-ZtjFIvA\_fs">https://youtu.be/-ZtjFIvA\_fs</a> The children have also began to write these letters by learning a short rhyme (mnemonic). Please refer to your child's home learning sheet, for help with these.

In PSED (Personal Social Emotional Development), the children have discussed our school community. There are lots of adults and children to meet! As part of this, the children have started to meet other people who attend and work at our school. We have visited the office and explored 'beyond the school hall'.



We are really proud of how calmly the children have collected and eaten their lunches since starting school. They have enjoyed following the new routines and trying new foods. Thank you for booking lunches for your children each day, as this is making our register time very efficient.

In our areas of provision, the children have enjoyed creating pictures of their families, going shopping and cooking tea in our role play areas, building structures in the outdoor large construction area and learning how to use all of our resources. To develop their fine motor skills, the children have been using tweezers and threading beads.

This week, your child has brought home a 'Reading for Pleasure' book reading book. The 'Reading for Pleasure' book is for you to enjoy reading together at home. These are changed weekly, on a Monday. Books are due back on Mondays, each week please.

# Key Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2)

What a fantastic start to the year we have had! It was so lovely to be able to welcome our children back into school after a busy and



exciting summer. It can be a little tricky adapting back to school, especially when there are new routines to learn, but our children were incredible! The Year 2s stepped marvellously into the role of being the oldest members of the class, rather than the youngest, and our Year 1s were super stars for adapting to life in Key Stage 1. We were so impressed by you all!



There was a very exciting start to the week. On Monday, we enjoyed the story "The Bog Baby" and spent the day getting creative as we made our very own Bog Babies from air-drying clay. We also made habitats for them from cereal boxes that we cut, painted and decorated. We used natural resources such as twigs and stones from outside to enhance and decorate the models and habitats. The results were amazing! The children had such a good time doing

them and were really inspired to write about the Bog Baby in their English lessons. We focused on the essentials of what a sentence needed to have, and the children were very careful and accurate when they wrote them. The children wrote some fantastic sentences and really showcased their writing skills.

This week, we have been impressed with how well the children have adapted to even more routines, as we started our full curriculum. This included swapping classrooms as we started our phonics and maths lessons, as well as working in groups for reading. In maths, we have been working on our understanding of place value and the number system, using practical resources to represent numbers physically. We also looked at pictorial representation of numbers and how they relate to the written numerals. This included the use of tens and ones to represent teen numbers.



It has been a fabulous and very positive start to the year. Our children have done so well and worked very hard. We can tell already that our learning journey this year will be one that takes us very far indeed. Well done Key Stage 1 and keep up the great work!

# Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3 & 4)

Year 3 and 4 have had a fabulous start to the school year! The children have been full of enthusiasm and have thoroughly enjoyed the start of our new topics.

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In history, last week, the children were very excited to discover that they were going to be learning all about the Ancient Egyptians this term. To start the topic off, the children shared what they already knew about this period in history and then, of course, what they were really looking forward to finding out. They came up with a wide range of interesting and thoughtful questions, which, hopefully, they will be able to discover the answers to by the end of the topic. Afterwards,

using their chronological awareness from previous history learning, they were also able to accurately place the Ancient Egyptians on a timeline and ordered key events that occurred during the Ancient Egyptian period. This week they have looked at a variety of artefacts and used their knowledge to decipher what they could have been used for. The children also discovered fascinating facts about King Tutankhamun and created a fact file about him. It included key information such as his approximate birth, length of reign, when he died and when his tomb was discovered along with other facts that interested them.

#### Reading books:

Children have now also been allocated a reading book which is appropriate to their current reading level. Unlike the reading for pleasure books, which have a designated return day each week (if they choose to), the children are given the responsibility to ask to change their book whenever they have finished reading it. Similar to the pleasure for reading books, each time it is changed, the child's individual reading record will be updated.

# Upper Key Stage 2 (Years 5 & 6)

We've kicked off our theme, 'Industrial Revolution', by looking at the work of the artist L.S. Lowry and recreating his distinctive style as we begin to study the landscape of cities at the time. After lessons learning how to use sketching pencils and how to draw perspective, we will be creating our own versions of Lowry's famous 'matchstick people'.

The children were fascinated to see how simple shapes and lines could bring whole scenes to life, and they enjoyed comparing Lowry's industrial landscapes with photographs of modern city skylines. This unit will also link with our reading and history work, as we explore how the growth of factories and transport changed everyday life for people during the Industrial Revolution.





For the start of the academic year, we have refocused and built on our prior learning of the Zones of Regulation. Throughout the school day, we have opportunities to reflect on how we are feeling and the impact that this has on our well-being. Building on the strategies we have previously learnt, we are continuing to manage our emotions in

order to be effective learners. We are also practising techniques such as breathing exercises, movement breaks, and talking with a trusted adult when we need support. These skills are helping us to recognise that everyone experiences a range of feelings, and that knowing how to respond positively can make a big difference to our learning and friendships.



This week in RE, we started our topic which focuses upon the big question, 'Why do some people believe in God?' We looked at census data for the population of the UK and the variety of responses regarding differing faiths. We learnt about what the terms theist, atheist and agnostic mean. The children enjoyed discussing their own ideas and asking thoughtful questions about the different beliefs people hold. Over the coming weeks, we will

explore stories and teachings from different religions, compare similarities and differences, and think carefully about the role of faith in people's lives today.

It has been a wonderful start to the term, and the children have shown great curiosity, creativity and resilience as they dive into their new learning. We are so proud of the way they are settling back into routines and embracing the challenges of the year ahead. You may find it interesting to talk with your child at home about the topics we are exploring in school, whether that's asking them to sketch a quick 'matchstick figure,' share which strategies help them regulate their emotions, or explain what they have discovered about different beliefs. Thank you for your continued support; together we can make this an exciting and successful year of learning.




#### Attendance & Payment Policy
