# Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)

We have continued our learning journey in **phonics** this week by learning four new graphemes; h, b, f and I. The children are also excited to be making progress with sounding out and blending phonemes together to begin to read words. They are delighted that they are beginning to crack the code of reading!

This week, in our '**Journeys**' theme, we have explored space travel. We began this last Friday by taking part in a Royal Astronomical Society story telling session called 'Fly me to the moon'. This was an online session using songs, puppets and signing to introduce the phases of the moon, produced specifically for children in Reception. The children thoroughly enjoyed joining in and learnt new facts too! During this week, we have then introduced the concept of travelling into space through stories including 'Whatever Next' and 'Aliens love underpants'. Linked to these stories, the children have enjoyed acting out the events using small world resources and large

cardboard boxes, made junk model rockets and played planet and alien themed maths games to determine more or less. They have also deepened their space related vocabulary.

## Key Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2)

Year 2 children have been really enjoying their recorder lessons with Miss Freitas. So far, they have looked at how to hold the recorder correctly, how to blow so that the recorder doesn't squeak and how to play the note 'B' by correctly covering the holes. The note 'B' has then been used to play two pieces that have different rests in between the notes.



The children have worked very hard in English this week, writing instructions about how to make a wormery. The children had great fun on Monday afternoon, adding sand and soil to plastic bottles. Then topping it with vegetable peelings and last but not least the most exciting part was finding worms to place in their wormeries. After the worms were happily in their new homes, black paper was taped around the outside to keep the





Every day, the children are also practising their reading skills in phonic lessons. They are amazing at recognising the sounds, reading the sounds within words and then including the words in sentences. In reading, we continue to look at different vocabulary and discuss the meaning behind words in the context of the book. We have also been answering comprehension questions by

finding the words within the text to show where we found the answer. Thank you for also reading with your children at home.

# Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3 & 4)

We have been blown away by the book reviews the children completed based on their 'Reading for Pleasure' book as part of their homework. We cannot wait to make our reading recommendation book out of them. The children have also continued to thoroughly

enjoy their whole class novels. Class 6 are reading 'George's Marvellous Medicine' and are finding the mischief George is getting up to highly entertaining. Class 7 are still intrigued by the mysterious 'Iron Man' who appears from the ocean and devours the farmer's machinery. Class 8 have been enjoying 'Danny Champion of the World' and exploring the close relationship between a father and a son.

In history, the children have delved into the earliest forms of farming that were developed during the Stone Age. They learnt about how humans survived during the Palaeolithic times by foraging for edible plants and hunter gathering. This all changed by the Iron Age in which people cultivated land to grow crops, settled and built houses and began to domesticate wild animals.

> All three classes have begun working on addition during maths. Children have been learning to spot patterns in the numbers they are adding, developing mental methods to add two or more numbers together and looking at written methods to add more complex numbers.

Another super week in Lower Key Stage Two, well done Year 3 and 4!


# Upper Key Stage 2 (Years 5 & 6)



As part of our computing this term, we have been building on our prior learning of using 2Calculate, a spreadsheet programme. We inputted data and used the function wizard to create formula. Using this formula, we were able to create a random number generator which could create and tally 500 dice rolls in mere moments. We then used this information to produce running totals in order to answer some mathematical questions.

In RE this week, we have continued our study of Humanism. This year, we are building on our understanding of the core values and the way in which Humanists live their lives. We have taken part in lessons considering the moral obligation of making the right choice, even if there are no consequences to ourselves.





As part of English and science this term, we have been studying why living things need to adapt and evolve. We have been learning that through the process of evolution, and as a consequence of 'survival of the fittest', plants and animals develop features to enable them to become better suited to certain habitats and environments.

Following the consultation, each admission authority will formally set ('determine') their admission arrangements for admission in 2024 - 2025 by 28 February 2023. Determined policies will be on the City of York Council website by 15 March 2023 after which objections can be raised.
