Headteacher's Message

Teachers are looking forward to meeting with parents/carers for the face to face appointments next week. It is important that you can have uninterrupted time to talk to the teacher. We would therefore politely request that if your child(ren) need to come with you to school, that they wait on the chairs in the waiting area of the hall whilst you are speaking with the class teacher. Thank you also for your understanding that teachers will need to adhere to the 10 minute appointment length, to avoid delays for the next parent/carers. If on meeting, you and the class teacher find that more time is needed, a further appointment will need to be arranged.

I would like to say a really big thank you to all of the parents/carers who have shared their expertise with the children in classes and even in an assembly, this term. This has included an author, a dentist, and this week, a scientist! If you would like to share your expertise with our children, do please let us know. We love welcoming visitors!

Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)

This week has been 'The Three Little Pigs' week.

The children have thoroughly enjoyed exploring building houses with a range of large construction materials and then using these to act out the story in our outside classroom. These have been fantastic! We have also created our own paper plate little pig, used a magnetic theatre to act out the story and explored the properties of different materials (sorting these into hard and soft materials).

Our phonics lessons, this week, have consolidated the teaching of a range of digraphs. We have practised reading and writing words with multiple digraphs, for example, rubbish and farmer. We have also practised reading longer words containing the ending -ing. To do this, we practise reading the 'root word' look and then sound out and blend the ending i-ng. After splitting the word up to sound it out in two parts, we then blend the word altogether, for example, I-oo-k-i-ng = looking. This can be practised on our weekly phonics home learning sheets. In **Maths**, this week, we have begun to understand numbers beyond 10. The children have started to create numbers using the Numicon pieces that represent each number. To make 12, they learnt to use a 10 and a 2 etc. We are also beginning to count larger numbers from 10, for example, starting at 10 and moving up in 1s. We shall continue to revisit number bonds to 10 at the start of each maths lesson.

On Thursday, the children enjoyed a walk into Haxby. They investigated the different houses which are in the town. The children enjoyed discussing the materials which the houses are made of and using new words to describe the houses, for example, bungalow and roof. It was lovely to be able to investigate houses at first hand rather than through pictures.

This week has also been National Science Week. As part of this, we have investigated which materials are strong enough to build a house and which blow down easily. The children experimented by using a range of materials and a hairdryer. They had lots of fun!





Thank you for sharing the activities which the children enjoy doing outside of school. It is lovely to see their interests. This week, if your child has been out and about in our local area, we would enjoy seeing what they found.

Key Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2)



Key Stage 1 have gone wild this week, with lots of exciting learning based around animals, researching about different animals and writing non-chronological reports about them. We looked at some information texts and the features of them. We then wrote our information under subheadings, being sure to include technical vocabulary. We tried to make our information as interesting as possible by using

different types of sentences. There are definitely some future David Attenboroughs in the making!



Also in science this week we have been investigating seasonal changes. We have thought in detail about the differences between winter and spring. For example, we have learned about what happens to plants and animals during winter and how the weather and daylight changes. We learned about what impact the changes of seasons have and looked



for signs of spring, such as new growth, animals being born and birds migrating back to our country. We also developed our scientific working skills by using a classification key to ask questions about objects based on their features and characteristics.

We have been enjoying our P.E as well. Mr Walton has been working with us, teaching us multi-ability ball skills, such as passing, dribbling and running into space. We have enjoyed working as a team and taking part in fun relay activities.

Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3 & 4)



The Year 3 and 4 children (and staff) were super excited this week to begin their Roman Chariot Design Technology project. To begin with, the children looked at the structure of a Roman Chariot and labelled key components including the wheels, carriage, axle and shaft to ensure that they all knew how they are built and worked. They then looked at a variety of different chariot deigns and how they were decorated. The children designed their own patterns for the front and side of their chariots and then planned out the steps to make their chariot by

creating a short story board that included diagrams and descriptions. We can't wait to start making them next week and are looking forward to adding our recently gained knowledge of simple circuits to them, to add a motor so they move on their own.

All of the children thoroughly enjoyed their science week activity based on fingerprints. During this activity, the children all had the opportunity to take their own fingerprints for each finger on both hands by using charcoal to create the print. They then identified the pattern that each print created from loop, whorl and arch and discovered that although we have similar patterns everyone's fingerprints were unique.





During English, the children have been working on their narrative story writing skills. Our fantasy story is based on a short clip called 'Something Fishy' which is about a girl who discovers an underwater world where clothes have transformed into schools of fish, turtles, an octopus and a shark. After identifying the 5 parts of the story, the children have practised writing their own introduction and build up, using subordinating conjunctions, expanded noun phrases and fronted adverbials of time, manner and place to add more detailed description.

Upper Key Stage 2 (Years 5 & 6)



For British Science Week 2023, we explored different forces. Throughout the week, we were able to move between the different UKS2 classrooms to undertake a variety of investigations. In Class 9 with Mr Tod, we investigated building bridges with paper and then tested their strength using weights. We needed to think about the connections between weights, forces and measures. In Class 10, Mrs Stephenson showed us how to create 'spinners' to investigate air resistance. We needed to consider what we

needed to change in order to make the 'spinners' go faster or slower. In Class 11, Mr Bennett helped us to create boats to investigate buoyancy and surface area. We experimented by building different designed boats and by spreading the weight across the boat to prevent it tipping.

As part of our RE lessons, we began our exploration of charity, art and faith. In this unit, we will reflect upon the importance of art and architecture in religion whilst also considering why some believers see generosity and charity as more important than buildings and art. Over the coming weeks, we will look at the art and architecture of different faiths.





As part of our PSHE lessons, we have been learning about what constitutes a positive healthy friendship (e.g. mutual respect, trust, truthfulness, loyalty, kindness, generosity, sharing interests and experiences, support with problems and difficulties); that the same principles apply to online friendships as to face-to-face relationships. In our lessons, we have considered looking at things from others people's perspective and how to resolve disagreements.
