Headteacher's Message

Good afternoon

I hope you have been able to enjoy some of the sunshine this week. It certainly supported a fabulous sports day for Reception and Key Stage 1 on Monday. Thank you to everyone who was able to come along and support one or both of our sports days; we hope you enjoyed them as much as we did.

This week we have shared Phonics Screening Check results with Year 1 parents/carers and Multiplication Check results with Year 4 parents/carers. All of these children have achieved amazingly well and we are so very proud of the children and the progress they have made as a result of their determination and positive attitudes. We expect to receive results in mid-July for the statutory tests completed by Year 6 children and we will share those results with parents/carers as soon as possible after that point.

The children will have their first transition session with their new class for 2024-2025 next Wednesday 3rd July. On this day, you will also receive a letter sharing which class your child will be in. Please read the letter in full as it also contains additional important information. As always, a lot of care and thought has gone into the organisation of classes.

We also wish our Year 6 children well as they have their transition visit to their new secondary schools on the same day. We are always sorry to see these children leave us but we take joy from knowing we have supported them to be in the best possible position for starting Year 7.

I have been absolutely blown away by the quality of entries submitted for the spirited arts competition. The children have taken such care and displayed such creative, artistic talents in addition to the thought that has gone into the messages the pieces are conveying. Some entries are now proudly on display in my office as well as around the school. Ten entries have been submitted to NATRE as our entrees to the competition; we will hear back later this year if any of these are chosen as winners.





Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)

This week, our dinosaur topic has explored whether dinosaurs were found in the United Kingdom, in the past. The children enjoyed learning more details about the palaeontologist Mary Anning and her wonderful fossil finds on the south coast.

This week, in phonics, we have read words which have a suffix added to the end of them to change present tense to past tense words. Words with an –ed suffix ending can often be pronounced in different ways. An example of this is **bumped** – this word sounds like it ends with a **t** sound and **grunted** – sounds like it ends with an **id** sound. We also continue to revise and learn how to read and spell the tricky words **the**, **I**, **go**, **no**, **you**, **said**, **so**, **have** and **like**.



In literacy, the children have enjoyed reading a variety of 'Harry and the dinosaurs' stories. They selected and drew pictures of the things they would put in their bucket. Then, they wrote a sentence to explain their bucket. We are very impressed with the children's writing progress.

In maths, we have consolidated our addition and subtraction skills by playing board games. These are a brilliant way to practise counting on and back. There are also many other maths skills which can be practised when playing games such as snakes and ladders.





In our RE lessons this term, we have been learning about belonging. The children began by discussing what teams and groups they belong to. They then learnt about how Christians know that children are special to God. This week, our Reception children have learnt about infant Christian baptism. If your child(ren) has attended an infant baptism, perhaps they could share this with us.

The children thoroughly enjoyed our sports day this week. We were very proud of their athletics skills, concentration when following instructions and being 'good sports'. Thank you for coming along to watch your child too. They really did enjoy showing you their skills.





During this warm weather, the children are enjoying accessing our areas of provision in the outdoor classroom. To ensure children are safe in the sun, we insist that children wear a hat and take regular breaks inside. Please help us by ensuring that children have their water bottle and a hat in school each day. Thank you.

Key Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2)

It has been a wonderful week of sunshine, with the British summer almost making as much of an effort as our fabulous Key Stage 1 children. This got off to a flying start this week with our Key Stage 1 Sports day. It was an incredible event full of sporting excellence, as the children ran, threw, jumped and kicked their way to glory. It was great to be able to celebrate the

achievement of Team Minster but what was even better was the fantastic sportsmanship on display as our children cheered and encouraged one another. The behaviour and attitude of the children was exemplary and it was so amazing to be able to share this event with the families and friends that came out to cheer us on. We would all like to say a huge thank you to Mrs Atkinson, who put so much time and effort into making the event the success that it was.





It wasn't just sporting excellence that was on display this week. In English, we rounded off our history topic on our two explorers by writing a non-chronological report (information text) to compare Christopher Columbus and Neil Armstrong. Our report not only included information about the two men's lives, but also had a detailed paragraph to compare them and explain why they were so historically significant. We also included an introduction and conclusion

to tie our ideas together. It was incredible to see just what our children had learned and to see their historical interpretation skills on display.

In science, we were looking once again at food chains and how energy is passed up the food chain from the producer (a plant) to the apex predator at the top of the food chain. We used technical vocabulary, such as producer and consumer to describe the herbivores, and omnivores that make up the food chain, as well as discussing the effect that each

Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3 & 4)

Another super week in Lower Key Stage 2.



At the start of the week, Year 3 participated in pedestrian training with York City Council. During the training, the children learnt how to cross a road safely by ensuring they stop, look and listen, they cross in a straight line and not diagonally and that they look in all directions if they are crossing at a T junction.

In history, the children have continued to enjoy learning about WWII. This week, the children have delved into the home front. The term home front refers to the activities of the people in their home countries, which support the military during a war. This is called the war effort. As part of this, the children learnt about 'Dig for Victory', how people salvaged waste to make new products due to supplies being severely limited and how propaganda encouraged women to go to work.





In English this week, the children have been revisiting and reinforcing various writing features they have learnt over the year. Using different images as writing stimulus, the children were given writing criteria to meet within their writing based on the image. For instance, the children were required to use inverted commas to punctuate speech or a fronted adverbial of time to tell the reader when something was happening.





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
