Important safety messages

Please could we ask that younger children waiting to collect older siblings, when the gates open at 3:10 pm, remain waiting with parents/carers rather than roaming/scooting/biking on the large playground please? This does create a distraction, particularly for our children in the front classrooms.

Please also support us by not allowing children of any age to scoot or bike on the playground at drop off and pick up times or to climb/stand on the benches/frame of the wooden shelter. These actions are unsafe.

It is tricky for staff to need to ask children to get off bikes/scooters and/or stop standing on the wooden shelter, when parent/carers are present; we would therefore very much appreciate your help with these issues.

Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)

Reception classes

This week, our dinosaur topic has explored fossils. The children have learnt how we know about dinosaurs today and why fossils are such amazing and important finds. During the week, the children have taken on the role of a palaeontologist while digging for dinosaur bones. They have then used them to create dinosaur skeletons. In the play dough area, children have created their own fossils by using a range of natural objects to create the fossil markings. We have also created salt dough fossils using the same methods. The children have also enjoyed learning about Mary Anning who was a palaeontologist in Dorset in the 1800s.

The vocabulary we learnt last week, has continued to be used in our understanding the world sessions and while children are discussing dinosaurs. As a reminder, we are focussing on using, **dinosaurs**, **extinct**, **prehistoric**, **fossil**, **palaeontologist**.

This week, in phonics, we have read words such as, screech, three, slight, tree, spear and free. We also continue to revise and learn how to read and spell the tricky words are, pure, sure, little, here, were, says, when, what and one.



In Maths, we have learnt how to share numbers equally. The children have shared out dinosaurs into two lands and shared dinosaur eggs into nests. They have also explored sharing between 3, 4 and 5 and investigated what happens when an odd number is shared between an even number. We have been very impressed with their sharing skills.

During this warm weather, the children are thoroughly enjoying accessing our areas of provision in the outdoor classroom. To ensure children are safe in the sun, we insist that children wear a hat and take regular breaks inside. Please help us by ensuring that children have their water bottle and a hat in school each day. Thank you.





Please continue to post children's activities on Tapestry, as they really enjoy sharing these with us at school. If you would like help to do this, please ask.

E_{arLy} Years Foundation Stage



Key Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2

It has been a week of sunshine and wonderful work in Key Stage One. We are all enjoying the summer sun and the opportunity to play on the field during break times. Lots of us have been staying 'sun safe' by wearing hats and bringing our own sun cream. Please can we ask that all children have sun cream in a named bottle that they can reapply themselves?

> We have been learning all about wildlife in science recently. We have learned about life cycles and the ways that different plants and animals change as they grow older and make new versions of themselves. In particular, we have focussed on caterpillars this week and the amazing way that they transform into butterflies as they grow. We watched some videos with stunning images that showed them in detail and featured timelapse photography that showed them going into, and emerging from, a chrysalis. We also used information texts to help us identify their features and describe the process of metamorphosis.

In English, we were using this knowledge to write an explanation text about the life cycle of butterflies. We learned that explanation texts are meant to make processes like this easier to understand for the reader and included all the relevant features in our own writing. These included an engaging introduction and a step-by step description of the stages of development, using present tense verbs and time connectives.

> In RE, we continued our work on 'belonging' and what this means to different faith groups. In particular, we learned about a Jewish Shabbat and how this day of rest brings the family together. We held our own Shabbat in class with bread that we shared like challah and Kiddush wine (in our case, Ribena!) We loved the experience of sharing these with our friends like a Jewish family would. We also learned about how Baptisms are used to welcome people into a

collective group in Christianity and how Anglican weddings use a vow and symbols to show that two people

It has been another excellent week. We are so proud of our wonderful children and all the amazing things that they do.



Key Stage 2 (Years 3 & 4)




This week in English, the children have had the opportunity to put their own spin on our 'Lighthouse' story. They used the various writing features they have learnt over the year, such as expanded noun phrases and fronted adverbials, in their writing. They should be proud of the exciting stories they wrote about the dependable light from the lighthouse unexpectedly going out. Thankfully, people from the local village came to the rescue by lining the clifftop with lanterns.

In art, the children have been exploring the work of Georgia O'Keeffe. We have found out about her amazing life and shared our opinions of her artwork. They then sketched their own flowers on a large scale. The children's observational skills were fantastic and the detailed fine lines that they used really brought the shape of the flower alive. We can't wait to see what they look like when they paint them with water colours next week.



The children have thoroughly enjoyed computing this week as they have been learning how to make simple animations. They have used their drawing skills on the computer (not easy!) to make the individual frames which were then put into a 'film strip' which when played come together to make a crazy face. We are looking forward to developing these skills to make moving pictures with backgrounds and sounds.





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Key Stage (Years 5 & 6)



As part of our unit of work in Science, we have been learning about the digestive system. We came to understand that, as food passes through our digestive system, it is broken down by acids and enzymes, and the nutrients are drawn back into our circulatory system to be used in different cells around our body.

In PE this week, we had a 'Danish Cricket' taster session. A large, soft ball was used instead of a cricket ball and the batter had the choice from a range of bats and racquets with which to strike the ball. Once the batter had hit the ball, they had to run a reasonable distance to a 'safe zone'. Should a fielder catch the ball, they were out as in normal game of cricket. However, if a fielder was to throw the ball at the batter and hit them instead, they were also out. This was lots of fun!


Outdoor Summer Disco – Thursday 22nd June
