We look forward to seeing all of the children back in school on Wednesday 4th January 2023.



Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS)

This week has been full of Christmas learning and fun! The children enjoyed a Christmas craft morning where they made a selection of decorations using increasing cutting and design skills. We have also enjoyed our Christmas party, playing traditional party games and even enjoying a virtual visit from Father Christmas. During the week, there have also been opportunities to explore the ice in the outside classroom and practise gross motor skills on our scooters.

On Wednesday, the children enjoyed walking to St Mary's Church and joining in the carol service. It was lovely to hear them singing some of their nativity songs again and they really enjoyed looking at the inside of the church too.

In **phonics**, this week, we have revised the phonemes which have been learnt this term. The children have used these to sound out and read words, both in their phonics sessions and while reading the reading books. We are also very pleased with the progress the children are making in reading the tricky words (words that can't be sounded out) and also spotting these in signs and books around the classroom.



In **Maths**, this week, the children have investigated capacity through measuring and making reindeer food. They followed instructions and counted out all the spoons of ingredients. We $lap{1}$ hope the children enjoy sprinkling this on the ground ready for Rudolf and his friends.

In the new term, the children shall be partaking in weekly PE lessons outside (on a Tuesday). It is advisable for children to have some tracksuit bottoms and a jumper for these lessons, to keep warm please.

After the Christmas holiday, we are also going to be using cardboard tubes and would appreciate you saving any of these. Please bring them to school on your return. Thank you.

Using Devices Safely

As Christmas is getting closer, children and young people all over the country will be writing lists to Santa or giving hints about what they would like under the tree.

Technology is now an extremely popular item on many children's lists with tablets, smartphones, game consoles and smartwatches likely to be asked for this year.

Whilst we want children to enjoy their presents, it is also important that parents/carers look at ways to ensure that their children use these devices safely. This includes setting parental controls and understanding that video games have PEGI ratings similar to the classification for films.

Other things that you may want to consider is managing screen time so that you can monitor the amount of time being spent on each device. This is useful for meal times or during the school holidays.

Finally, once the tinsel has come down and we welcome the New Year, make sure that you talk to your children about online safety.

Upper Key Stage 2 (Years 5 & 6)

As part of our Design and Technology unit, we have been developing our sewing skills using a variety of stitches: running stitch and blanket stitch. We created some wonderful Christmas decorations as part of Christmas craft morning.



Within our maths sessions, we have been working on fractions and division. As part of our fraction lessons, we have been calculating a fraction of a given value. In Mr Tod's set, we have completed our work on division. We divided with decimals and completed equations with missing numbers. We are all beginning to understand the importance of recalling our table

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facts at speed. The majority of maths work, taught in Years 5 and 6, is dependent on the quick recall and application of these facts; this supports us in being able to learn new and complex concepts.


